

In 2024, DESTA deepened its role as a catalyst for change within Montreal's Black Anglophone community. Through bold initiatives in food security, justice reform, workforce development, and entrepreneurship, we created meaningful pathways for individuals to not only overcome barriers, but to thrive, lead, and build generational resilience.

This year, we continued to see the impact of our work across communities. From supporting formerly incarcerated individuals in securing meaningful employment, to training the next generation of broadcasters, to guiding entrepreneurs as they developed and launched their own businesses, we witnessed lives changing in real time. Our food security program nourished bodies. Our wellness program nourished spirits, while our incubator and skill-building workshops cultivated confidence, connection, and capacity.

Each initiative reaffirmed a core truth: when Black communities are given access, resources, and the space to lead, the results are transformative.

With every milestone reached, DESTA is rewriting the narrative around Black economic and social equity in Montreal, centering dignity, creativity, and community empowerment at the heart of everything we do.


This work was made possible through the leadership of Kassandra, the commitment of our resilient team, and the active engagement of our board.

DESTA continues to work to level the playing field by providing high-impact, skills-based training programs that position participants for success in industries where Black professionals have been historically underrepresented.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT & EMPLOYABILITY

We launched Montreal's first-ever DJ Workshop for Black Women in collaboration with the Misa Negra music collective, with a 100% completion rate and a growing waitlist.

Our Pathways to Broadcasting program, in partnership with CBC, led to internship offers for two participants.

DESTA's Job Board grew to 271 registrants, with multiple successful job placements, including three re-entry participants

securing employment.



DESTA remains committed to breaking cycles of systemic exclusion and creating long-term opportunities. With your support, we can expand our programs, reach more individuals, and continue building a future of equity, empowerment, and Black excellence.



ENTREPRENEURSHIP & BUSINESS GROWTH

In partnership with Ujamaa Initiative for Black Entrepreneurship (UIBE) and Concordia University's Community Service Initiative (CSI), DESTA continued our 12-week Business Readiness Bootcamp and continued to offer individualized GrowthWheel Coaching to 24 entrepreneurs.

We also co-developed a Customized Scale-Up Training Program to help Black entrepreneurs scale their businesses. This initiative will provide coaching, funding access, and mentorship, further strengthening Montreal's Black business ecosystem.

With funding from the Government of Canada's Community Support, Multiculturalism and Anti-Racism Initiative (CSMARI) we introduced 'Rooted in Success', a 12-month calendar featuring entrepreneurs from Montreal's Black English-speaking community. 4,000 calendars were printed and distributed across the island of Montreal. We also developed a Black Business Directory App - The Business Reference which officially launched in May 2025.

DESTA SOCIAL JUSTICE & RE-ENTRY SUPPORT

RESTORING DIGNITY, REBUILDING FUTURES

The journey from incarceration to reintegration is rarely straightforward. It is marked by systemic barriers, stigma, and a lack of access to the very resources needed to rebuild one's life. Every person deserves the opportunity to start over, with dignity, support, and the tools to thrive.

In 2024, DESTA's Justice & Re-Entry Program provided a lifeline to dozens of participants navigating parole, transition, and the complexities of re-entry into society. Our multidisciplinary approach includes legal advocacy, trauma-informed mental health counseling, and employment readiness services, all rooted in cultural relevance and compassion.

Building on our commitment to human rights and restorative justice, DESTA offered support services to 60 participants in obtaining parole, employment, housing and legal support.

Parole Success

In 2024, DESTA's legal team achieved a 100% parole approval rate, a groundbreaking accomplishment that highlights our strategic and compassionate approach.

Challenging Systemic Bias

Trauma Counselor, Rosetta Sowkey, developed an effective assessment model to counteract the racially biased parole assessments conducted by Correctional Services Canada (CSC). These reports humanize our participants' experiences, providing parole boards with a more accurate, trauma-informed understanding of their rehabilitation.

Workforce Reintegration

Through partnerships with organizations like the Viola Desmond Justice Institute, we secured employment opportunities for reentry participants, with one individual landing a full-time job in construction.

Each of these victories represents more than just numbers, they are stories of resilience, determination, and the power of community support.



DESTA **FOOD SECURITY**

FEEDING RESILIENCE, GROWING OPPORTUNITY

Food is about sovereignty, cultural identity, and the power to create a better future. At DESTA, we approach food security as both a basic human right and a launchpad for economic empowerment. For too many in our community, accessing fresh, affordable, and culturally relevant food remains a daily challenge. We respond not only by addressing immediate needs, but by nurturing long-term solutions rooted in self-sustainability, entrepreneurship, education, and community engagement.

In 2024, DESTA's Food Security program continued to provide innovative solutions that addressed immediate hunger while building community resilience.

We're planting seeds of change one garden, one plate, one workshop, and one entrepreneur at a time.

Food Security & Culinary Entrepreneurship

In 2024, our food programming grew to include a range of interwoven initiatives. The Community Pantry pilot project distributed over 2,100 dry meal servings and 225 kg of produce, ensuring access to nourishing meals during a time of rising food costs. But our impact didn't stop at distribution. Through sold-out recipe development workshops led by vegan chef and incubator participant Jamal Spence, we turned nutrition into an entry point for culinary skill-building, community gathering, and cultural connection.

Our Black Horticulture & Urban Agriculture (BHUA) participants grew food and businesses simultaneously, learning to design gardens, harvesting produce for the pantry, and presenting fully developed business plans. One participant even began prototyping a pickled okra product that was taste-tested by peers.



Growing More Than Food: Empowering Entrepreneurs and Cultivating Community

Through the Chef Incubator, we provided 10 aspiring culinary entrepreneurs with coaching, branding support, and access to fresh ingredients via the Nutritower system. These participants are not only building sustainable businesses, they're becoming anchors of food sovereignty and cultural pride within the Black community.

Our GardenShare program expanded to include 18 new garden installations, serving 43 people and bringing the total to 63 gardens since the program's inception. These gardens not only increased access to fresh produce for families but also served as hands-on training spaces where participants developed food growing skills and supported others as peer mentors, strengthening both food literacy and community bonds.

We have proudly been a part of the DESTA Food Incubator since March 2023. Over the last year and a half, we have witnessed firsthand the incredible impact DESTA has had in empowering Black chefs, food entrepreneurs, and creatives. RECLAIMING REST, CONNECTION, AND COLLECTIVE HEALING

In Q4 2024, DESTA proudly relaunched our Wellness Program with the highly anticipated return of Black Joy Sundays in collaboration with BMHC Montreal. This time in the form of Mini-Retreats, designed to offer participants intentional space for rest, movement, healing, and reconnection.

The inaugural Black Joy Sundays Mini-Retreat was held at Centre Culturel Georges-Vanier and 50 tickets sold within days, demonstrating the deep community need for culturally grounded wellness spaces. Nearly 40 participants gathered for a powerful afternoon that included guided movement, wellness workshops, peer dialogue, and moments of reflection all designed to affirm the importance of Black healing and joy in the face of daily pressures.

As we move through 2025, DESTA is committed to expanding this programming, offering more frequent and accessible opportunities for participants to recharge, reflect, and reconnect with community and self with the introduction of more immersive programming as well as monthly healing



FUNDING LANDSCAPE

In 2024, DESTA raised \$893,000 to support our programs and operations, with the majority of funding coming from government grants. This strong public investment reflects growing recognition of DESTA's impact and the need for culturally relevant, community-based services for Montreal's Black Anglophone population.

While government support remains a critical foundation that allows us to deliver consistent, high-quality programming, we continue to pursue funding diversification through private foundations, donations, sponsorships, and earned revenue models, and are looking to plan for more long-term sustainability.
